

The 2023 Topics for the Junior Public Speaking have been sent to all Club Presidents, Secretaries and Junior Public Speaking Chairpersons for distribution to schools. The new Student Entry Form will be on the website soon, along with our new Judges Code of Conduct, Child Safe Procedures and risk assessment form. Other items, including handbooks, will be updated over the coming months as well so keep an eye out for the new ones.

There has been quite a bit of planning happening with the Junior Public Speaking program, with the possibility of a V District Final in September, this was approved at the Cabinet Meeting today. More details will be made available soon.

Due to this happening the new timelines are as follows:

- ⇒ School Finals to be held by the end of May.
- ⇒ Club Finals to be held by the end of June.
- ⇒ Regional Finals by the end of July.
- ⇒ **District Finals** to be completed by the **20th August**.

It is proposed that the V District Final will be held on Sunday 10th September and for this to take place, there needs to be 3 V Districts to participate in the Junior Public Speaking program – this date and venue will be confirmed once other details are finalised.

Please remember to make sure that all Members, Non Members, Judges and Chaperones who participate in your Clubs program have a Working With Children Check and please forward these to me with their names, Working With Children Check numbers and expiry date.

I look forward to another bigger and better year.



The Australian Lions Foundation Ltd "MOTTO" is Helping Lions, help their Communities.





We set up for Lions Awareness Day at our market on Saturday 25th. The No Flies on Us stand is always available at every market.



Hudson Monash Paediatric **Precision** Medicine (HMPPM) Program

Rajithri (Dilru) Habarakada is the Australian Lions Childhood Cancer Research Foundation (ALCCRF) Biobank Specialist for the Hudson Monash Paediatric Precision Medicine (HMPPM) Program. in a maternity leave appointment.

In the collaborative HMPPM Program, scientists at Hudson Institute have established a Biobank' of childhood brain/CNS and solid cancers including living organoids or lab-grown 'minitumours' - to trial and develop targeted treatments and improve clinical outcomes, survival rates and quality of life (limiting sideeffects) for childhood cancer patients.

As the ALCCRF Biobank Specialist, Dilru brings technical and operational knowledge to the development of the 'Living Biobank' platform at Hudson Institute and oversees all biobanking activities for the HMPPM Program. She also coordinates the Monash Children's Cancer Biobank led by Dr Peter Downie at Monash Children's Hospital. Dilru completed a Bachelor of Biomedical Science and Psychology at Victoria University, then



HMPPM the joined Program in 2021. She is currently undertaking Sciences at the University her knowledge in of quality areas research, cancer prevention and education.

Paediatric therapies Telethon Kids Institute Cancer Immunotherapy

Australian Lions Childhood Cancer Research Foundation Trustee, Peter Lamb, with Telethon Kids cancer researcher and clinician. Dr Rishi Australian Lions Childhood Cancer Research Foundation has announced it will provide \$1.05 million of funding to the Telethon Kids Institute.

The funding will support the Telethon Kids Cancer into Centre's vital research aimed at improving survival childhood rates, longevity and quality of life for children with cancer. cancer.

"At Australian Lions Childhood Cancer Research Foundation we believe every child deserves a

Australian Lions chance at a healthy life," Childhood Cancer Research Foundation Chairperson John Thorpe said. "We are very proud to be providing \$1.05 million worth of funding to Telethon Kids.

Chair of the Telethon Kids Institute, the Hon. Julie Bishop, said they are excited to be partnering with well-respected, such community organisation like Lions Australia. "We are so grateful for Australian Lions Childhood Cancer Research Foundation's support," Ms Bishop said. "This \$1.05 million in funding will enable the Telethon Kids Cancer Centre to continue its leading research into childhood cancer - particularly in the area of cancer immunotherapy, which focuses on supercharging the body's natural defences to destroy cancer cells."

Mr Thorpe described cancer immunotherapy as one the most exciting and promising cancer being developed. treatments particularly childhood cancer. "It is our hope that this work will benefit kids all over Australia and beyond," he said. "More than 800 children aged 0-14 years are diagnosed with cancer in Australia each year. Many of these cancers are aggressive and hard to treat and we are losing too many young lives. "Although survival rates have improved greatly for some, most cancers take a toll on young people's lives and often side effects of treatment can be serious and lifelong. "Telethon Kids Cancer Centre's research into cancer immunotherapy is focused on finding ways to help these children's immune systems fight cancer cells.

This will be revolutionary in the treatment of Cancer childhood cancer." Professor Terrance Johns, Head of the Telethon Kids Cancer Centre, said that as of Melbourne to expand one of Australia's only comprehensive, paediatric the cancer immunotherapy centre, the Telethon Kids of Cancer Centre was making its mark on medical care, research. "The Centre is on a mission to prevent paediatric disease and improve the wellbeing of children with cancer. We bring together leading researchers and oncologists focused on developing that destroy cancer cells. minimising the side effects to children's short- and long-term health," Professor Johns said. The \$1.05 million of funding to Telethon Kids Institute builds Australian Lions Childhood Cancer Research Foundation's long history in supporting







LOGGING INTO THE NEW V6 WEBSITE...

In October we launched a new, revamped district website. This was necessary as the old system is soon to be discontinued (this also applies to club websites that use the same system). The site is much more modern, and is already ranking much better in searches.

The new site has a members area, and logging in to it is a little different. You now have a username which is in the format firstnamelastname – so for example, neilstuart or johnhoughton. All lower case, no dots or spaces.

Your passwords have been changed and randomly assigned. Note that we have not yet loaded all email addresses for everyone, so the password reset function will not work if your account does not have an email address. If you would like to log in to the website you will currently need to email webmaster@lionsv6.com to request access. We will then load your email address and send you a password reset email.

Once you have a password, remember in future to log in with your username (not your email address) and the chosen password

At this point the members area basically has just what was on the old site. Some of it is out of date, but will soon be updated, and we hope to develop it over time into a really useful resource.

V6 DISASTER RECOVERY SUPPORT - ELMORE VILLAGE



hit from both sides of the town, with only 8 houses residents shell shocked.

Some of the residents were renters and were evacuated out of their homes soon after the event, others who were uninsured found themselves in a position of great stress, not sure of how or when they could afford to repair their properties, still others whose homes were uninhabitable needed to be evacuated to a safer place. Some families chose to remain at their properties, putting caravans in their yards and continuing to live at Recreation Room too. They organised a trip to home though under much different circumstances.

Government agencies were soon on the ground helping, organising evacuations and support. Some of that support came in the shape of a caravan but these were in the nearby town of Elmore, the Elmore Field Days Event Centre to be exact!

As a member of the V6 District Disaster Recovery Support Team, Lion Lee and her husband PDG Norm, took a visit to the Event Centre to see what was being done for the evacuees and what if any, help or assistance was required from the District Lions. The first impression was confronting, bare paddocks and row up on row of caravans or Dongas (cabins with a bed and bathroom). The people moving into this accommodation had their immediate needs met, food, shelter and clothing. It was their mental well-being that was our first concern. What were they to do, what was going to keep them, and the children occupied and out of the cramped conditions of a caravan?

When the devastating floods arrived in Echuca The Cohuna Leo Club asked how they could be of then Rochester, the waters had already been help, knowing from the Lismore Flood event how through many parts of our District. Rochester was devastating this type of event can be for children. They were advised that play equipment was not affected by the flood waters!! Leaving the needed and books. They got together and created their signature project a "Hug in a Rug", a teddy in a sleeping bag (these had been taken to Lismore children), 150 were made along with 50 library bags.

> The Leos purchased outdoor giant Jenga, Connect Four, cricket sets along with a large wooden dolls house, bean bags and big cushions to sit on, colouring books, pencils and lots more, \$500 in total was donated. Setting up a library area in the Elmore with their Donut Van to deliver their donations. With Lions help, they also donated a BBQ lunch to everyone available including free donuts!

> The "Village" is being managed by officers from the army, from Townsville in conjunction with a management team from Downer Defense. subsequent visit, we approached the officer in charge, Site Manager Adam, with our concerns for the resident's mental health. He was open to any suggestions we came up with. Very soon after we had a team from Downer to help us put together some ideas for a community garden, playground and BBQ area. Once the plan was finished, it was up to the DRST to find funding to complete the project. Donations were coming in to assist the flood victims, which was great, but these funds would be needed in other areas.

> An approach to Bunnings Echuca Activities Organiser Mel to see if we could get some garden beds donated for the Community Garden Area.

Mel decided it was best to travel to Elmore Village, assess the situation for herself and see how Bunnings could be of assistance. This visit produced the most amazing response!

Bunnings not only came to the party with four large, raised garden beds, four children's garden beds, soil, plants, hoses and garden tools, but also supplied two large BBQ's, outdoor table and benches, four park benches, four outdoor chairs and four market umbrellas and a gas heater.

This support was increased on the 9th February, when 12 of their staff volunteered to visit the Elmore Village and construct all the furniture and play equipment!!!

The DRST purchased a large piece of play equipment from Bunnings for the children to play on. This equipment included a tower, the top being a fort, underneath, a cubby with its own BBQ and sink, climbing wall, swings and two slides, one of which is a tube curving down to the ground.

Corowa Men's Shed are constructing two large outdoor BBQ tables and benches which will complete the BBQ area and Yarrawonga Lions Club are building two 'Buddy Benches' which will be placed near the playground equipment, so mum has somewhere to rest while the kids play.

Another piece of equipment that was requested was a large outdoor movie screen and projector. This has been installed and put to good use already.

Lions from the DRST were also on hand to assist the Bunnings team to erect and install the play equipment. Elmore Lions Club provided their BBQ trailer and Lion Paul to cook lunch for all the workers and interested residents, thanks also to Lion Lynda from Wodonga for her assistance cooking lunch.

Residence of the Village came out to see what was going on and stayed on to help plant and water the gardens. Two residents have taken ownership of the gardens and set up a roster to make sure they were well watered and looked after.

The community meeting area was created, much to the delight of the residents.

A feeling of great pride and achievement. Teamwork makes the dream work!!

Although the Elmore Village is a temporary site, the equipment provided will remain for the use of the residents while they remain at the village, once they have been re-housed, the equipment and furniture will be transported to a Lions Park in the area, so it remains for their use.
