

With the School competitions now completed, the Clubs are now preparing for the Club Finals, which are to be completed by the end of July.


Zone Chairpersons will be organising the Regional Finals, these are to be held in the first 2 weeks of August -

The Reckon One package has a lot more additional features such as easily producing receipts, where I have an email to send it to, and better reporting. Even though there is a cost involved, it is hoped that the system will significantly reduce the cost of the mandatory formal audit.
