#### Safety Message...

Safe Work Australia developed a single set of laws to be implemented across Australia, known as the 'model' or 'harmonised ' laws. The purpose of the model WHS (Work Health and Safety) laws was to reduce



the burden of having to comply with different obligations across different states and territories.

Currently, the Commonwealth and all states and territories, except for Vitoria, have enacted legislation based n the model WHS laws.

Despite harmonisation, some differences between the application of WHS laws in each jurisdiction remain.

It is important to check the laws in each state and territory that your organisation operates in.

Compliance with the WHS laws is important. If your non-for-profit organisation doesn't comply with these laws, it risks substantial fines. Directors and Officers also risk fines and imprisonment if they don't comply with due diligence obligations.

This information comes from "A guide to understanding and complying with work health and safety laws". This guide focuses on the legal duties and obligations that organisations and offices or organisations owe to various people under the WHS laws, including employes, volunteers, contractors, trainees and members of the public.














Congratulations to the Lions Clubs who have been walking up a storm for Lions Lap the Map for Diabetes.

## **GMT Report**

As of October 30th, we have 1067 members after beginning 2023/24 with 1048 members. We have added 54 new members and dropped 35. We are net +19 for the year and net +4 for the month of October. Congratulations to Barham Koondrook who inducted three new members in October

We are still trending very positively regarding new members as DG John's goal was 95 new members. However, I continue to add that we need to keep vigilant regarding the drops. One member was dropped during the month.

Another of DG John's membership goals is the chartering of one new club. The reestablishment of a presence in the Mansfield area is a key goal. I have booked a site at the Mansfield Bush Market for Saturday 4th November. We will also have our membership trailer on site.

Regarding Multiple District and bearing in mind our "Big Audacious Mission" (BAM), as of 17th October eight districts are not in transition. All Districts that are in transition (includes V6) are in positive growth. There are now four new clubs however twenty-seven were promised for this year. The Multiple District is sitting at net +313 members. While this figure is very good compared to past years at this time, we are a little behind in terms of the overall BAM targets. Multiple district should be sitting at +400 by the end of the month of October.

At our recent convention at Beechworth Membership National Coordinator PDG Ann Eldridge spoke about membership and BAM. While pleased at where we are currently, PDG Ann reiterated that we must remain focussed to keep those BAM targets a reality. It is up to all of us to recruit new members and there are lots of resources available to assist members and clubs to grow their membership. As PDG Ann pointed out - more members mean more service.







## Logging on to the V6 Website...

In October 2022 we launched a new, revamped district website. This was necessary as the old system is soon to

be discontinued (this also applies to club websites that use

the same system). The site is much more modern, and is already ranking much better in searches.

The new site has a members area, and logging in to it is a little different. You now have a username which is in the format firstnamelastname – so for example, neilstuart or johnhoughton. All lower case, no dots or spaces.

Your passwords have been changed and randomly assigned. Note that we have not yet loaded all email addresses for everyone, so the password reset function will not work if your account does not have an email address. If you would like to log in to the website you will currently need to email <a href="mailto:webmaster@lionsv6.com">webmaster@lionsv6.com</a> to request access. We will then load your email address and send you a password reset email.

Once you have a password, remember in future to log in with your username (not your email address) and the chosen password

At this point the members area basically has just what was on the old site. Some of it is out of date, but we are continuing to update each area, and we hope to develop it over time into a really useful resource.


