This would include catering, projects and even at meetings.

AED's play a crucial role in increasing survival rates during sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) incidents.

AED's are designed to be user-friendly and require minimal training. With their intuitive interfaces and clear instructions, AED's enable even nonmedical personnel to administer life-saving defibrillation shocks quickly.

GMT Report

As of April 26th, we have 1,055 members after beginning 2023/2024 with 1048 members. At the same time last year, we had 1,075 members. We have added 99 new members and dropped 92. We are net +7 for the year (net growth 0.66%). We are trending positively regarding new members as DG John's goal was 95 new members by the end of June 2024, however we have surpassed the goal of no more than eighty drops.

Congratulations to Bright, Cobram, Echuca, Lake Mulwala, Lavington, and Strathmerton who inducted new members during April. Additionally, on Wednesday evening April 23rd I had the pleasure of inducting three new members into the Cobram Lions Club.

One of DG John's membership goals is the chartering of one new club. The reestablishment of a presence in the Mansfield area has been a key goal. DG John, PDG Peter and Margaret Poels and I attended the Easter Saturday Bush Market. We were hoping to gain further interest with the aim to increase the number of applications for membership. While we failed in signed membership gaining any further applications. I am confident that we will see the formation of a Club Branch in Mansfield. Cobram Lions hosted a fantastic market on Easter Saturday, we even spotted the Easter Bunny. This was followed by another brilliant market April 27th.



Hope Lions' Happenings

There have been plenty of happenings at HOPE Lions in the past 4 months.

Since January – April 2024 we have successfully raised over 1200 seedlings for TreeProject Victoria. This is a voluntary environmental project for the club.

The five different native tree species, 3 native grass species and one native plant species were all grown for Ovens Landcare Network. They will be planted out over the next couple of months in north east Victoria.

Our "Blooms of Hope" project has made over \$600 in the last 4 months from markets at Stanhope and Numurkah. People generously donate plants and cuttings which are grown and potted up to a certain size pot and then sold when flowering. We are most grateful to Bunning's Echuca who donate our year's supply of compost. Proceeds from this project go to Childhood cancer research.

Since January we have raised over \$1100 from our "Recycle" project.

The club has many clients who save their recycle and once a month it is collected, sorted, bagged and deposited. The proceeds from this project also go to childhood cancer research.
