- Youth Scholarship Programmes: Several Lions Cubs in the District offered scholarships to outstanding students in the community, enabling them to pursue higher education or vocational training programmes.
- Health and Well-Being Projects District
- Diabetes Awareness Campaign: Various Lions Clubs have been involved in organising Lap the Map days focused on spreading awareness about diabetes prevention, offering free blood sugar testing, and distributing educational materials to over so many community members.

#### **FUNDRAISING INITIATIVES**

 Art Auction: Lions Club of Cobram held there Annual Art Show, displaying local artists work and raising much need funds for community activities.

#### CHALLENGES FACED BY LIONS CLUB DISTRICT 201 V6

- Post Pandemic Recovery: some clubs are still recovering from the impact of pandemic, with reduced membership and participation in certain activities.
- Funding and Resource Constraints: Several clubs have reported difficulty in raising funds due to the current economic climate, limiting the scope of some of their service projects.
- Volunteer Fatigue: Maintaining volunteer engagement and enthusiasm is an ongoing challenge for some clubs, particularly in rural areas.

#### PLANS FOR UPCOMING PERIOD

- Service Expansion: The district is planning to expand its Health Care Screening project throughout schools in our district.
- Leadership Development: More emphasis will be placed on training for our club officers and members.

**Lavington Lions** - Members of Lavington Lions, family and friends gathered on 27th August to celebrate the life, and mourn the passing of Lion Graham Walker.


Graham had a long involvement in community welfare, especially in disability services, administration, and management.

#### **GMT Report**

As of September 27th, we have 1,037 members or -17. During the month of September eight members were added and one dropped. Congratulations to Corryong, Katamatite, Tongala, Upper Kiewa Valley, and Wodonga who have inducted new members in September.

Regarding Multiple District and bearing in mind our "Big Audacious Mission" (BAM), as of September 27th the Multiple District has 22,132 members or net +96, with 709 added and 613 dropped since July 1st. Seven of the eighteen districts are not in transition. For our V6 District to get out of transition and get to the 1,250 figure we will need to recruit 213 members or 4 new members per club net.

Along with DG Julie, I attended the "Nurturing a Culture of Growth: MISSION 1.5 Summit" that was held in Sydney from August 31st -September 1st. District Global Membership Team (GMT) Coordinators, Global Extension Teams (GET) Coordinators, and DG's from across our multiple district and New Zealand attended a very well organised and very productive weekend. Mission 1.5 is the drive over the next four years to reach 1.5 million members worldwide, so we as Lions can better meet the growing needs of our communities and serve more people than ever before. The Mission 1.5 strategy is: understand Mission 1.5. to lead by example, to be accountable, and to take action. We need to accept the challenge not only Mission 1.5 but our commitment to the Big Audacious Mission or BAM (30,000 members by 2030 and 50,000 members by 2050). Our MD 201 BAM membership challenge is net gain +1150/year, 24 new clubs and 1 member/club/year. The challenge for us in V6 is the chartering of 1 new club and net +1 member/club/year. A culture of growth is critical to our service and the future of Lions. We are accountable to each other and the community we serve. Success is going to depend on all of us working towards these goals.

On Sunday August 22nd our District Global Action Team (GAT) held a Global Membership Approach (GMA) Zoom meeting hosted by District GMA leader PDG Omen Ndlovu. The three key areas of Lions - leadership development, membership, and service were

discussed. Regarding membership, our district supporting made a commitment to membership challenges - BAM and Mission 1.5. have а commitment to arow membership by recruiting new members and retaining our valuable members. We recognise that we cannot achieve our district membership goals without the active involvement of our clubs and members across our district. We recognise that we need to support our clubs in working with us to achieve these goals. Therefore. resources including the Club membership e-Book, and 100 Plus Ideas, together with a cover letter from District GMA leader PDG Omen Ndlovu will be emailed to all clubs.

One of the key membership resources found in the Club membership e-Book is "Just Ask! – Fostering a culture of recruitment" guide. I strongly encourage our clubs to use this guide as it will assist your club in navigating the Global Membership Approach (GMA) process to recruit new members and effectively manage club growth by cultivating a culture of recruitment in your club. I encourage club membership chairpersons to please contact me for any further information or support.



Have you ever thought how much your Lions Members are worth to your Community?

My own Lions Club, the Australian Lionsonoz Lions Club, does on average between 800 and 1,000 hours service every month in community service, now let's put that into a dollar value to give you an idea on what that "Lions Member" is worth to your community and to show you just how much money our Lions Club is saving our local councils, state governments and our federal government.

OK, let's do the sums, if we say our club does on average 900 service hours a month, and let's say that work is worth \$50.00 per hour, then that equates to \$45,000 a month, or \$540,000.00 a year. Staggering, isn't it?

We have over 1,300 Lions Clubs in Australia with over 30,000 members, the figure would be astounding when start to think what the dollar amount would be if you were to add up all those service hours performed by Lions in this country, then putting it into a dollar value.

So, the next time you see Lions selling raffle tickets, cooking at a BBQ, selling the Lions Xmas Cakes or doing dirty hands-on work for the community in parks and or helping the elderly in our communities. Stop and Think, "How much is that Lion worth".

## October Safety Tips LADDER SAFETY

Ladder safety is essential in many workplaces, such as warehouses and offices. Incorrect use of a ladder can lead to falls and serious injuries. Everyone should be trained or be fully aware on the right way to use ladder, which includes choosing the correct ladder for the task, checking it for defects before use, setting it up on a firm and level surface, and maintain three points of contact (to hands and a foot or two feet and a hand) at all times while climbing or descending,

Reinforcing these safety measures regularly can prevent ladder related accidents and

ensure a safer work environment.

Slips, trips and falls constitute some of the most frequent accidents and can result in serious injuries. 
