


Hannah is hoping to join the group again in 2025.

There were some big milestones in these numbers with the exciting milestone of our first interstate delivery of a Diabetic Alert Dog, followed by 2 more throughout the year. By the end of 2024, we will have also accredited 28 Assistance Dogs, which is almost double our numbers last year.

Our Breeding and Puppy Programs have grown significantly, with our puppies showing tremendous progress in both development and confidence. Thanks to our dedicated team and volunteer puppy carers, each puppy is receiving an exceptional start to their journey to become an Assistance Dogs. After a slow start to the year, four gorgeous litters of future Assistance Dogs were introduced into our

world and we are eagerly awaiting the fresh pitter patter of another litter due mid-December! We also proudly celebrated the graduation of 27 adorable puppies from our Puppy Pre-school, equipping them with the foundational skills needed to excel in their training journey.

Our thriving volunteer program ensures our dogs are loved and cared for daily. We are deeply grateful to our volunteers, Lions Clubs, and sponsors, whose generosity is the backbone of Australian Lions Hearing Dogs.

This year we implemented a Bed and Breakfast Program, which enables our dogs in training to be dropped off to 'school' four days a week and spend the rest of their time in a loving volunteer home. The standard of the BnB dogs is very high and we are excited to bring on more volunteers in the program next year. This year we have had eight dogs in the BnB program with five already successfully delivered to their recipients.

As we welcome summer and the festive season, we want to sincerely thank you for incredible support and kindness your throughout 2024. Please note our Training Centre will be closed during the holidays, though our dedicated staff will still be on-site caring for our dogs. Our office will close from Tuesday, December 24th, and reopen on Tuesday, January 2nd, with our emergency line available for urgent matters. Wishing you a joyful and safe holiday season—we can't wait to see you in 2025!



The Foundation was established in 1996 for the purposing of assisting those persons or organisations in need within the boundaries of the Lions 201V6 District.

Since that time, in consequence of monies donated by the public and by Lions Clubs within the District, the Foundation has been able to financially support requests for a large number of Lions Clubs. Support has been extended to families who have suffered losses by the devastation of fires, floods and droughts as well as individuals who, in consequence of physical infirmity or mental disability, require help and assistance.

Requests for support are made by a Lions Club within the District and considered by the board of Directors of the Foundation. All funds made available are paid to the Lions Club seeking support on the basis that the Club distribute the monies and confirm to the Board themanner in which such funds have been disbursed.

The Board meets at least four times each year. Extraordinary meetings are held in the event of an emergency. All Board members are active Lions and members of Clubs within the District. Chaired by the immediate Past District Governor, two Board members are elected each year by delegates at each District Convention.

The availability of funds is, of course, dependent upon the generosity of Lions Clubs. Your support is much appreciated and will ensure that your Foundation will continue to grow and be in a position to assist those persons and organisations requiring help within our communities.

Funds can be made available from the Activities Account of your Club.

The Foundation offers the Chris August Award, named in honour of the founding member of the Lions Club of Wangaratta, and recognised as the "Father of Lionism in North Eastern Victoria and Southern New South Wales." The prestigious Award is available for presentation by Clubs to deserving members of Clubs and the general public, upon the donation of the sum of \$500 to the Foundation. Payments may be made, if required, by instalments.
