

Wangaratta Road Safety School

From the 1st July 2013 the Lions Club of Wangaratta accepted an offer from the Apex Club of Wangaratta to take over the ownership, operation and management of the Apex Road Safety School in Ryan Avenue, Wangaratta.

The Road Safety School has been in operation since October, 1970, when it was established by the Apex Club of Merriwa Wangaratta in response to concerns by the community about the lack of a safe environment in which children could be taught Road Safety.

Our purpose today remains the same, to:

- Develop children's traffic awareness and provide road safety information and support to organisations in a safe and secure environment.
- Allow children to gain confidence and develop road safety skills, away from the dangers of our busy roads.

Our sessions are based on content from Vic Roads resources, where we visit and reinforce 5 core objectives of road and bike safety.

- · Left hand side of the road
- Footpath usage (up to 12 years of age)
- Helmet fit
- Stop, Look, Listen, Think message
- Road signs

The facility can also be hired out privately for kids parties and events.

"After 76 years of service to our community, our club was forced to close. As our community changed, we were slow to adapt and we saw fewer people requesting to join our club. Because we wanted only quality members, we did not actively recruit new Lions. We focused upon retention, so we continued doing what our existing members wanted to do. When we declined in membership, we felt that if we just kept serving, all would be well. We felt that our Service spoke for itself and we did not want to appear prideful, so we did not aggressively promote our club in our community. We continued with the same projects and found that fewer people were interested in participating in them. As we aged, we were not able to continue with some of our traditional projects so we focused more on writing checks and less on hands-on service. Covid came and we could not meet in person so we lost contact with some of our members. After Covid, we continued to meet for lunch and enjoyed each other's fellowship, but outsiders were not attracted or welcome to our small group of close friends. We declined to form a branch because we did not want to build another club that would compete with us. As our numbers dwindled, we repeated our officers, and when we were unable to find Lions willing to serve as President, Secretary and Treasurer, we decided to stop meeting and close the club."
