This innovative equipment will transform medical research by enabling scientists to observe cell behaviour in real-time, providing new insights into how cells respond to treatments for a wide range of diseases including cancer, diabetes, bone disease, and many others.

As President AP Singh is an avid cricket fan we organized a guided tour of the MCG, but I believe the highlight of the day was when Tony Dodemaide a former Australian Player and current Australian selector presented President Singh a signed cricket bat with the signatures of the Australian team from the 2023/2024 Pakistan Tour

The tour was followed by a dinner in the evening where around 150 Lion members from across Victoria enjoyed a two-course meal, it was a very enjoyable evening. With the highlight being President AP Singh presenting a new charter to Leo Club of Brighton from District V5 also a Leo club named Leo Club of Barham Koondrook was formed in our own District but not in time for President AP Singh to present the charter to them.

Breast cancer is the most common cancer diagnosed in Australia in women. It is estimated that breast cancer will account for approximately **28 PER CENT** of all new cancers in women in 2024.

SURVIVAL



The chance of surviving at least five years (five-year relative survival) has increased from **78 per cent in 1990-1994** TO **92 per cent in 2016-2020**.



The chance of surviving at least 10 years (10-year relative survival) is **87.4 per cent**.

Australia has one of the best breast cancer survival rates in the world.

Increasing survival is due to earlier diagnosis through screening and improved treatments.



In 2020, we estimate there were at least

10,553 PEOPLE

living with metastatic breast cancer in Australia.

We do not know for sure because they are not counted by our cancer registries.

will die from breast cancer. That means **9** Australians die from breast cancer every day.

District 201V6 Badge History



Historically 201V6 was created in 1978 when redistricting our nation was brought about by strong membership increase in Australia. The northern areas of Victoria and southern areas of New South Wales were combined and designated as 201V6. Each existing District had an identifying badge and there was an invitation extended to all the clubs in the new District to design a suitable badge for the new District.

I had trade qualifications in technical drawing and design and submitted my thoughts to the District officers concerned. My submission proved to be the chosen entry and the badges were produced and traded at conventions or exchanged internationally as part of the Australian Pin Traders Club. I have been an active member of Pin Traders for over 50 years.

Perhaps I should explain my thoughts about creating the badge. The new District shared the borders of Victoria and New South Wales and is divided by the Murray River. The water wheel is active in all parts of the total region and the Australian colours of green and gold are connected with every part of the District through the major rural agricultural industries.

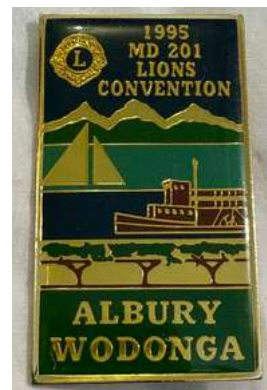

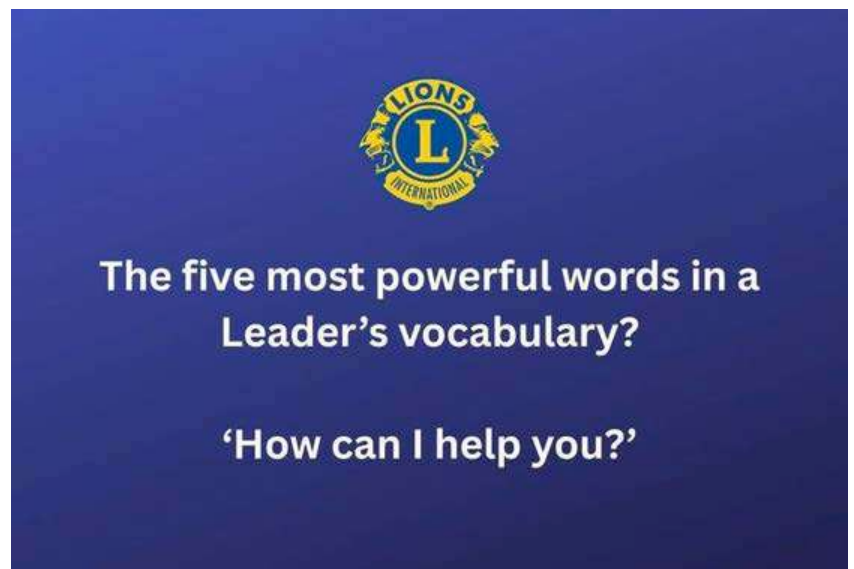
What They're talking about on Social Media...

Text Message SCAMS - how to identify them.

Signs a message might be a scam

The message:



Asks you to take immediate action, make a payment, or transfer money.



Asks you to click on a link or call a number provided in the message.



Asks you to log on to an online account with your username and password or to provide other personal information.



Is from a family member or friend saying their contact details have changed.



Threatens to stop a service or charge you if you don't act.



Suggests you or your accounts have been hacked or involved in fraud.



Suggests that there is a problem with your payment or your package delivery.

Steps to protect yourself from messaging scams

1. If someone you know sends a message to say they have a new phone number:



- a. try to call them on the existing number you have for them, or
- b. message them on the new number with a question only they would know the answer to, to check they are who they say they are.



2. Never click on links in messages.



3. If a message links to a website, don't click the link. Instead, search for the website yourself online, or use the official app.



4. Don't respond to a text message using the phone number provided.



5. Call the organisation or person back on a phone number you have found yourself, such as from the organisation's website.

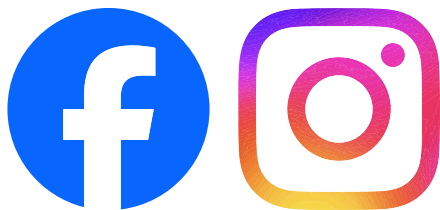

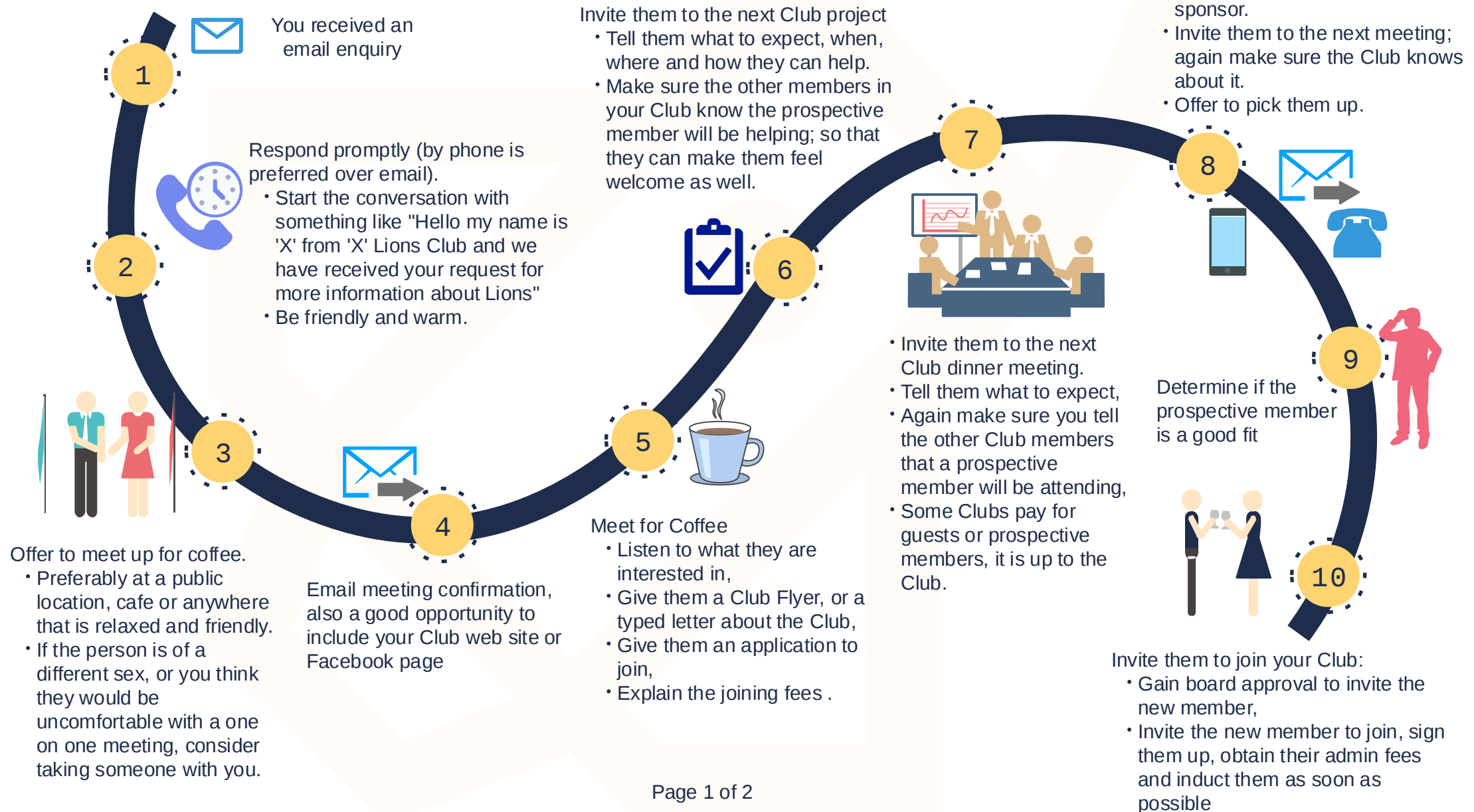


Club Enquiry Flow Chart
