

Lake Mulwala Lions

Identifying Children's Eyesight Weaknesses - Most children with vision problems will accept them and adapt. They rarely complain as they believe everyone sees the world just like they do. But it is difficult to catch a ball if you can't see it! Problems with eyesight have a serious effect on a child's development in their schooling, sport and day to day activities.

Local Lions Clubs including Lake Mulwala, Cobram and Wangaratta Lions, are currently visiting schools to help to detect issues like short or long sightedness, astigmatism and colour vision with four simple tests. Lions Eye Health Program referral service is the most comprehensive, free screening initiative available in Australia. It is conducted by fully trained, insured and working with children accredited Lions volunteers.

The most recent screening was held at Mulwala Public School on Thursday 16th October. The children found it easy to participate and enjoyed the session. Parents were provided with individual and confidential results confirming their child is within normal range or whether any potential issues were identified. For those needing further assessment it is recommended that their child visit an Optometrist for a full examination. These visits attract a Medicare rebate and so are cost free.

Other schools in our area will be offered the Screening Program in the next few months. Parent's need only to complete the permission form for their children to be taken through this valuable test. A good outcome for all.

What They're talking about on Social Media...

It was, and still is,one of the greatest honours of my life to have served our District as Governor during a time that tested every fibre of who we are, not just as Lions, but as people. And we cared deeply for our communities. Together, we weathered a storm unlike any we've known, and through that storm, we emerged wiser.

The pandemic taught us lessons we must not forget. It reminded us that resilience lives within us. That generosity isn't seasonal. That compassion isn't conditional. Our children have shown us how to bounce back. Our communities have proven their strength. We've become more resourceful, more connected, more hopeful.

But we must not lose sight of these lessons.

Today, we face new challenges. Our District is not without its turmoil. We have seen growth in membership, only to see those numbers fall. And we must ask ourselves, why? Have we lost sight of our purpose? Do our new members understand the heart of Lionism? Do they know who brought them in? Do they know why we serve? Do they feel connected, guided, and supported?

There is a difference between numbers and heart.

Membership is not just about counting heads, it's about igniting purpose. It's about knowing our governance, our responsibilities, our structures. Minutes and motions matter, not just because they are protocol, but because they are the framework of accountability. And we cannot ignore the elephant in the room. External politics have crept back in. Internal politics have intensified. And that is not what Lions Clubs International stands for. We have seen clubs collapse under the weight of misinformation, often from those who were entrusted to lead with integrity. This must stop.

To each and every Lion, never stop leading with your moral compass. Do not change your principles to appease politics both internal or external. Speak up when something is wrong. Challenge what is unjust. Innovate, yes, but not for the sake of change alone. Be bold, but be grounded. Be proud, but stay humble.

We are not immune to rough seas, but we are Lions. And with integrity at our helm and values as our anchor, calmer waters are always within reach. Let us remember the legacy we inherit from those who walked before us, who built our Clubs with bare hands and big hearts. We owe it to them, and to those who come after us, to lead with honour.

We are stronger together. We are better when united. Keep shining. Keep serving with pride and purpose and a morality compass.







