In closing Lyn and I would like to wish you all a Merry Xmas hope you have a great time spending it with family & friends.















What They're talking about on Social Media...

Fellow Lions, Can We Talk Honestly for a Moment? I've been hearing the terms "young lion," "younger lion," and "younger leader" used more and more — and I know they're usually meant as a friendly way to acknowledge someone's age. But the truth is, the way these terms land isn't always positive.

When we use them, it can feel like we're really saying:

- "You're younger, so you must have less experience."
- Even if that's not the intention, that's how it often comes across.
- Here's why that matters:
- Experience doesn't only come from age.
- Some of the most capable, committed Lions I know gained their experience through hard work, community service, life challenges, and stepping up long before anyone handed them a title. Reducing all of that to "you're young" doesn't honor the path they've already walked.
- People can feel talked down to without anyone meaning to.
- Being called a "younger leader" can sound like, "You're not quite there yet," even when that person is already carrying real responsibility, leading projects, and making an impact. Nobody wants to feel like they're still being viewed as "in training" just because of their birth year.
- It divides the room when we don't need divisions.
- When we group people by age even casually it can unintentionally create an "us" and "them." Lions Clubs work best when everyone feels equal at the table, no matter when they were born.
- It doesn't match our values.

At the core of our mission is dignity, respect, and shared service. Labels that imply inexperience go against the spirit of lifting each other up and recognizing the value every member brings.

Here's the truth we sometimes forget:


- A Lion who shows up, leads, serves, and invests their heart into the work is a leader, full stop.
- Not a "young" leader.
- Not a "younger" leader.
- Just a leader.

We all grow. We all learn. We all bring something to the table. And age — older or younger — is one of the least important parts of that.

Let's speak to each other the way Lions should: With respect, belief, and unity.

All club officers who have Portal access are able to create and enter service activity reports, while club Presidents, Secretaries and Administrators are able to complete the reports. If you require help submitting service activities on the Portal, various videos are available, either on the Lions International website, Lions Learn in the Portal and also Lions YouTube.
